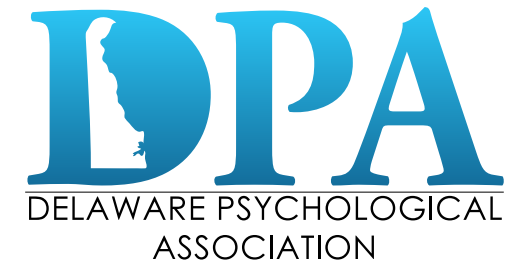

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

In 2018, the Delaware legislature passed HB 302 or the “Beau Biden Gun Violence Prevention Act” (aka the “Mental Health Gun Bill” as it’s known in Dover, DE). This bill, the goal of which is to keep guns out of the hands of those with dangerous mental illness, has changed laws regarding removal and re-access to guns for mental health patients. Attorney General Beau Biden worked closely with the mental health community beginning in 2013 to draft a compromise between gun control and gun access advocates. The development of this bill included some interesting and important changes to Title 16 of the Mental Health code.

Join attorney Andrew Wilson and forensic psychiatrist Neil Kaye as they discuss the history of the mental health code in Delaware with a focus on the “dangerous” standards that are often the focus of changes in the law. Dr. Kaye and Mr. Wilson will also discuss the intersection of mental health and guns and aim to educate the audience about the tensions and political challenges facing us as professionals as we grapple with these important topics and their sometimes-unintended consequences.

ABOUT THE PRESENTERS

NEIL S. KAYE, M.D. is Assistant Professor of Psychiatry and Human Behavior at Jefferson Medicine College and has been a Special Guest Lecturer at Widener University School of Law. He completed a residency in psychiatry at the Albany Medical Center Hospital and Syracuse University College of Medicine and a fellowship in forensic psychiatry at Syracuse University College of Medicine. He has been an Expert Reviewer for the United States Department of Justice Special Investigation Unit and a Member of the Governor’s Advisory Committee on Mental Health, Alcohol and Substance Abuse. He has been recognized by Delaware Today Magazine as a Top Doc numerous times and as a Top Psychiatrist in America by the Consumer Research Council.

Dr. Kaye is Board Certified in General Psychiatry, Geriatric Psychiatry,

and Forensic Psychiatry. He has been a member of the Advisory Board to the Board of Medical Practice for the State of Delaware, Past-President of the Psychiatric Society of Delaware, and is Chairman of the Ethics Committee of the Psychiatric Society of Delaware.

Dr. Kaye specializes in forensic psychiatry, neuropsychiatry, psychopharmacology and psychiatric research and has performed over 10,000 psychiatric evaluations. He has delivered over 1,000 lectures and has authored over 80 publications. His web address is: www.courtpsychiatrist.com.
